The next meeting of the Washington Traffic Commission will be held on November 1, 2019 at 8:00 a.m. in the Police Department Conference Room.

The following item(s) are presently on the agenda.

OLD BUSINESS:

4A 19-06-0011 Request for modifications to Front Street: We are currently in the process of evaluating the existing crosswalks on Front Street along with the signage associated with them. Engineering is working on a proposed crosswalk/signage package for review by the committee.

4B 19-09-0016 Complaints about signal settings at Mo 47 and Blue Jay Drive: At the last meeting, the committee discussed complaints about the traffic signals at that intersection behaving differently at different times of the day. Currently the signals are programmed to flash on Mo 47 for most of the day with the exception of the hours between 8:00am – 9:15am and 3:00pm – 4:15pm when school traffic is heavy. During those times the signals cycle on a timer. The complaints claim that traffic is not paying attention to the signals on Mo 47 because they are used to them flashing for most of the day, which is causing crashes. A crash history was obtained, which did seem to indicate a higher crash rate involving electric signal violations at this intersection when compared to other intersections on the same Mo 47 corridor. Engineering has reached out to Mo-DOT about the concerns and we are waiting on their response.

NEW BUSINESS:

5A 19-10-0020 Review proposal for business wayfinding signage downtown: A proposal was received to add business way finding signage along the city right of way in the downtown area. The committee will review the proposal along with images of the potential signage.

5B 19-10-0021 Request to increase speed limit on Vossbrink to 40mph: This request came through city administration.

5C 19-10-0022 Review of current restrictions for ATV's and UTV's on city streets: The committee will discuss the current restrictions for these types of vehicles along with potential changes if need be.

5D 19-10-0023 Request for additional speed limit signage on Rabbit Trail Drive: This request came from a resident, who is requesting the additional signage as a speed control measure.

5E 19-10-0024 Review of parking complaints on residential streets bordering Elijah McLean's: Complaints have been received from residents, who have been having issues with event parking spilling over on to residential streets as a result of the recently opened Elijah McLean's.

5F 19-10-0025 Review of current two-hour parking zones along Mercy Property: Complaints have been received about violations of the two-hour parking on Third Street along Mercy's Property. When the topic originally came up, it was questioned whether or not the two-hour parking was even needed anymore. The committee will discuss this formally.
