* A motion to amend the contract with Lime Scooters to include the 10 p.m. to 5 a.m. curfew effective immediately made by Councilmember Wessels, seconded by Councilmember Holtmeier, passed without dissent. Discussion ensued regarding the Traffic Committee’s recommendation from the September 3, 2021, Washington Traffic Commission Meeting. Topics of discussion were a 2-year contract with Lime exclusively which can be terminated with a 60-day notice, create parking stations for Front Street only, enact a curfew to shut down all scooters between the hours of 10 p.m. and 5 a.m., utilize the impact fee to pay for any clean up needs (graffiti removal as needed) and allow for special requests for festival weekends.
