Lamb: So, as we have been discussing this summer going over items that we're going to incorporate within the budget; Mary's got the summary for you in front of you for tonight prepared that. Drastically nothing has changed, other than we do have the proceeds to go ahead and purchase the industrial park that we are still in negotiations with. That is included within the budget for us to go ahead and purchase that. We will find out, that closing wouldn't be until the end of October. Other than that, everything else that we've given you, the budget highlights that I've given to you in the memo for the last two meetings remains the same.

Mayor: Okay, Mary.

Sprung: Okay. Included in your packet is the proposed budget for fiscal year October 1, 2021 to September 30, 2022. This proposed budget includes Estimated Revenues, Other Financing Sources and Projected Reserves for a total of \$67,165,270.

Mayor: Okay, Sal.

Maniaci: Good Evening Council. On your agenda tonight is another request for a Special Use Permit at 821 East First Street for short-term lodging or informally known as an Airbnb is what most of the time the website they used to rent these. This allows them to do lodging anything less than 30 days.

This property is located, R-1B Single-Family Residential Zoned District. It is directly adjacent to C-1 Light Commercial, just one property off of Highway 47. They're requesting to have two units there that can be rented out. It does have access to the rear through Missouri Avenue as well as to the front on First Street so they have parking on both sides as well as a garage access from the rear.

This went to Planning and Zoning last week. They voted unanimously to approve this and then the applicant did speak and mentioned, we didn't get any phone calls from neighbors, we didn't have any comments from neighbors and spoke that the people that they did have conversations with are in favor of the investment to the property.

Mayor: Any comments or questions?

Sullentrup: Hey Sal...

Maniaci: Yes.

Sullentrup: Suppose this person gets this Special Use Permit and decides a few months down the road that they want to get back into the rental business and want to rent the house out monthly, do we have to get rid of the Special Use Permit?

Maniaci: Nope, so once it becomes active it stays active on the property. If they wanted to go back to long-term rental, it's just a change of occupancy from short-term to regular residential.

Right now, whenever you are, anyone who owns a short-term lodging, any Airbnb, they sign up for a business license and then an annual inspection to be done every June to make sure that it still meets the residential occupancy requirements. On the other hand, when you have a long-term tenant, you only have inspections whenever the tenant turns over.

Sullentrup: Thanks.

Lamb: If you have a discontinuance of the short-term lodging for more than a year...

Maniaci: No, that's if they haven't started within a year.

Lamb: If they haven't started within a year.

Maniaci: Yeah.

Lamb: But what if they do, if they go back, I'm going to follow-up on Steve's question, if it does become a long-term meaning greater than 30 days and they do that for more than a year, does the Special Use Permit go away?

Maniaci: I don't believe it expires which you start using it, correct Mark?

Piontek: Correct. Maniaci: Yeah. Lamb: Okay.

Maniaci: It only expires if they wait on a, if they sit on it for a year without beginning the use...

Lamb: Then...inaudible

Maniaci: Then it expires, but once you start it, it follows the property from owner to owner.

Wessels: Sal, when they do this do they have to submit some sort of plan? They're talking in their application, it sounds like they want to do some work on the place. I mean other than get it through the inspection process; do they have to submit anything else to you in way of what they're planning on doing?

Maniaci: Not in conjunction with this application. They have to go through the normal building permit process to make sure that everything is built up to code, get the inspection done. They don't have to submit any of those plans to get this approved because they could have applied for those enhancements at any time whether they're using it for short or long-term.

Sullentrup: Other than, report their earnings every month.

Maniaci: Quarterly, yes. They have to sign up for the Bed Tax and they have to submit their Tourism Tax quarterly. That's part of the business license. We have someone in our Finance Office that reaches out to anyone with an active lodging license and makes sure they're reporting quarterly.

Mayor: Any other questions? Maniaci: Okay, thank you.

Mayor: Is there anyone here who would like to address this item? Anyone from the neighborhood? Okay.

Dear Mayor and Council,

As you may recall the Parks and Recreation Commission recently made a recommendation to move up the Ronsick Turf Infield Project. The budgeted amount of \$350,000 was included in the Half Cent Sales Tax budget. The project will include removing Ronsick's grass infield and replacing it with a synthetic turf system specifically engineered for baseball. The turf system will reduce infield maintenance and allow more games to be played during wet weather. The goal is to complete the project by May 2022, if possible.

I anticipate having a contract for your approval at the October 4 City Council meeting. The turf infield will be purchased via a purchasing cooperative allowing the City to save both time and money. Since May 2020 this project has increased \$23,000+ due to the fluctuating market. I would like to lock in the price now to avoid any future price increases.

Dear Mayor and City Council Members:

In reference the subject project, the following dates apply:

1. Notice to Proceed Issued – August 17, 2021

2. Completion date – November 5, 2021

3. Actual start date – September 28, 2021

The lowest responsible bidder is Gershenson Construction Company, Inc, for \$635,104.36. They are located in Pacific, MO.

As you can see from the above dates, the contractor started well over a month after the issuance of the notice to proceed. This resulted in losing valuable construction time. As such, the project will not be completed in this construction season.

This leaves us with not many great choices to get the project completed this year. My main concern is not being able to complete demo before winter and downtown areas having open excavations for large amounts of time.

In order to get a large portion of the project completed and reduce risk for the City, we are proposing the change order to:

- 1. Split the schedule into two completion dates. This will allow the contractor to get Fair Street and the Shoe Factory portion done this year (November 25th). The remaining work shall be completed by April 15, 2022.
- 2. Require all excavations after November 19th to be filled and poured within 7 days of excavation.
- 3. Increase the potential for Liquidated Damages from \$950/day to \$1,500/day.

While not a great situation, we feel this provides a solution that:

- 1. Limits risk to the public
- 2. Increases Liquidated Damage amounts to ensure the new schedule is adhered to
- 3. Keeps the original bid to ensure there are no cost increases

BE IT ORDAINED by the Council of the City of Washington, Missouri, as follows:

SECTION 1: The Mayor is hereby authorized and directed to execute a Service Agreement MOU – Mobility Device Sharing Services Agreement by and between the City of Washington, Missouri and Neutron Holdings, Inc., a copy of which is marked Exhibit A and is attached hereto and incorporated herein by reference, and such other documents, certificates and instruments as may be necessary or desirable to carry out and comply with the intent of this Ordinance, for and on behalf of and as the act and deed of the City. The City Clerk is hereby authorized and directed to attest to and affix the seal of the City to the said Agreement and such other documents, certificates and instruments as may be necessary or desirable to carry out and comply with the intent of this Ordinance.

SECTION 2: The City shall, and the officials, agents and employees of the City are hereby authorized and directed to, take such further action, and execute and deliver such other documents, certificates and instruments as may be necessary or desirable to carry out and comply with the intent of this Ordinance.

Service Agreement MOU - Mobility Device Sharing Services

This Service Agreen	ment and Memorandum of Understanding ("Agreement") is made this
(day) of	(month) 2021, by and between the City of Washington, Missouri, a
Missouri municipal	corporation ("City") and Neutron Holdings, Inc. DBA Lime ("Lime").

RECITALS

- 1. A goal of the City is to provide safe and affordable multi-modal transportation options to all residents, reduce traffic congestion, and maximize carbon free mobility.
- 2. Sharable micro-mobility devices and related services are a component to help the City achieve its transportation goals and the City desires to make mobility device share services available to residents and those who work in the City.
- 3. Lime is a qualified provider of micro-mobility device share and related mobility products and services and proposes to operate a mobility device share program within the City.
- 4. Lime's Products and Services provide a benefit to the City, citizens, and the surrounding community and is consistent with the City's goals and policies to provide safe, environmentally friendly, and affordable multi-modal transportation options to the community, including Lime customers;
- 5. Lime will abide by all City ordinances and rules governing the use of public space to efficiently and effectively provide mobility device share services.
- 6. Lime possesses GPS, 3G, and self-locking technology in its mobility device fleet such that mobility devices may be locked and opened by Lime customers with a mobile application and tracked to assist operations and maintenance.

Agreement

- 1. <u>Use of City Property</u>. City authorizes Lime to use the public right-of-way for the purposes set forth in Section 2 of this agreement. This authorization is not a lease or an easement, and is not intended and shall not be construed to transfer any real property interest in City Property. The City reserves the right to place restrictions on the use of City Property for special events including, but not limited to, festivals. The City shall provide Lime with not less than ten (10) days notice prior to any special event and any restrictions on the use of City Property during the special event.
- 2. <u>Permitted Use</u>. Lime users may use the public right-of-way for the operation of mobility devices owned and operated by Lime for use in the mobility device share program. Lime shall not place or attach any personal property, fixtures, or structures to City Property without the prior written consent of City.

- 3. <u>Mobility Device Parking.</u> Lime shall instruct Users to not park mobility devices in any location other than upon the City sidewalk in such a manner as to afford the least obstruction of pedestrian traffic and provide a minimum of 3 feet clearance for pedestrians.
- 4. Loss or Damage: City assumes no liability for loss or damage to Lime's mobility devices or other property. Lime agrees that City is not responsible for providing security at any location where Lime's mobility devices are stored or located. Lime shall be liable for any damages caused to City property by any Lime user including, but not limited to, costs of repair or cleanup from any vandalism. Upon receipt of an invoice from the City for the costs of repair or cleanup Lime shall remit payment to the City within ten (10) days from the date of the invoice.
- 5. <u>Customer Acknowledgements:</u> Lime shall include a product feature administered through its mobile application that requires Users to acknowledge the following: (a) the parking requirements as outlined in Section 3 of this Agreement and (b) adherence to all applicable state and local laws.
- 6. <u>Lime Fleet.</u> Lime may maintain a fleet of sixty (60) mobility devices. Mobility Devices shall be equipped with GPS technology or other installed software in order to track and manage the fleet's operations. Thereafter, the City will allow Lime to increase the number of mobility devices in Lime's fleet up to a maximum of seventy-five (75) mobility devices when Lime submits a written fleet-increase notice to the City, and within such notice Lime demonstrates with ridership data that across the prior 30 days (or a 12-month rolling average after the first full year of operations) that designates the need for such an increase.

7. Indemnification.

- a. Lime will indemnify, defend, and hold harmless the City and its affiliates, officers, directors, shareholders, members, employees, agents, successors and assigns (collectively, the "Indemnified Parties") from and against any third party liability, actions, claims, demands, costs, losses or damages, including reasonable attorneys' fees (collectively, "Claims"), resulting from or arising out of this agreement, or which are related to Lime's (including its officers, managers, employees, contractors, agents, and volunteers) business conduct and operations, any violation of any laws by Lime (including its officers, managers, employees, contractors, agents, and volunteers), or any bodily injury including death or damage to property arising out of or in connection with any use, misuse, placement or mis-placement of any of Lime's mobility devices except as set forth in Section 8(b) hereof.
- b. Lime will not indemnify, defend or hold harmless the City or the City's Indemnified Parties from and against all Claims resulting from or arising out of the negligence or willful misconduct of the City or the City's Indemnified Parties for which Lime shall have no liability hereunder.

- c. The parties further agree that the indemnifying party shall not be obligated to defend or indemnify any indemnified party for Claims made against the indemnified party's policy of workers' compensation insurance, and that the indemnified party's policy of workers' compensation insurance shall serve as the primary coverage for such claim.
- 8. Insurance. Lime shall procure and maintain for the duration of this agreement insurance against claims for which Lime has indemnified the City pursuant to Section 8 of this Agreement. Lime shall maintain General Liability limits no less than Three Million and no/100 Dollars (\$3,000,000.00) per occurrence for bodily injury, personal injury and property damage, and with an aggregate of no more than Three Million and no/100 Dollars (\$3,000,000.00). Each insurance policy shall name the City as an additional insured and it shall be endorsed to state that: (i) coverage shall not be suspended, voided, or cancelled by either party, or reduced in coverage or in limits except after thirty (30) calendar days prior written notice by certified mail, return receipt requested, has been given to City; and (ii) for any covered claims, the Lime's insurance coverage shall be primary insurance as respects the City and any insurance or self-insurance maintained by the City shall be in excess of the Lime's insurance and shall not contribute with it. The insurance required to be provided herein, shall be procured by an insurance company approved by City, which approval shall not be unreasonably withheld.
- 9. Compliance with Law. Lime at its own cost and expense, shall comply with any statutes, ordinances, regulations, and requirements of all governmental entities applicable to its use of City Property and the operation of its mobility device share program, including but not limited to laws governing operation of bicycles. If any license, permit, or other governmental authorization is required for Lime's lawful use or occupancy of City Property or any portion thereof, Lime shall procure and maintain such license, permit and/or governmental authorization throughout the term of this agreement. City shall reasonably cooperate with Lime, at no additional cost to City, such that Lime can properly comply with this Section and be allowed to use City Property as specified in Section 2, above.
- 10. <u>Data Sharing</u>. Lime agrees to provide the City with access to an Application Programming Interface (API) offering data about its fleet and trip activity within the City, meeting the requirements of the Mobility Data Specification format. All information hosted within the API or retrieved from the API shall be considered a trade secret and proprietary information of Lime.
- 11. <u>No Joint Venture</u>. Nothing herein contained shall be in any way construed as expressing or implying that the parties hereto have joined together in any joint venture or liability company or in any manner have agreed to or are contemplating the sharing of profits and losses among themselves in relation to any matter relating to this agreement.
- 12. <u>Term</u>. This agreement shall commence on November 1, 2021, (the "Commencement Date") and shall expire on the date that is two (2) years after the Commencement Date unless earlier terminated pursuant to Section 13, below.

- 13. <u>Termination</u>. This agreement may be terminated by either party, for any reason, or for no reason, prior to the expiration date set forth in Section 12, above, upon delivery of at least sixty (60) days' written notice prior to the intended date of termination.
 - a. Upon termination of this agreement by either party, Lime shall, at its sole cost and expense, remove its property from the public right-of-way prior to the date of termination.
- 14. <u>Fees.</u> Lime shall submit a fee of five cents (\$.05) per trip taken on any Mobility Device Lime has deployed in the City. The per-trip fee shall be paid monthly based on data provided by the Lime in accordance with Section 10 (Data Sharing) without the necessity of being invoiced therefore by the City. The City may remove a Mobility Device from the City's right-of-way if it creates a hazard that threatens the health, safety and welfare of citizens. In such instances, the City will notify Lime as soon as reasonably practicable thereafter. If the City must remove a Mobility Device, Lime shall be charged a relocation and storage fee of twenty dollars (\$20.00).
- 15. <u>Amendment</u>. This agreement may be amended by mutual agreement of the parties. Such amendments shall only be effective if incorporated in writing and executed by duly authorized representatives of the parties.
- 16. <u>Permits.</u> The City shall notify Lime of any local permits required, if any, of the company for its local operation.
- 17. <u>Applicable Law and Venue</u>. The laws of the State of Missouri shall govern the interpretation and enforcement of this agreement. Any litigation concerning this Agreement shall be conducted in the courts located in Franklin County, Missouri, and the parties hereto agree to the venue and personal jurisdiction of these courts.
- 18. <u>Counterparts and Electronic Signatures</u>. This agreement may be executed simultaneously or in any number of counterparts, each of which shall be deemed an original, but all of which together shall constitute one and the same agreement. This agreement may be executed electronically.
- 19. <u>Notices</u>. Any notice required to be given in writing by either party pursuant to this agreement shall be deemed to have been properly given only if (a) sent by the United States Postal Service, certified mail, postage prepaid, or (b) sent by FedEx or other comparable commercial overnight delivery service, and, in the case of any of the foregoing, addressed to the other party at the addresses set forth below or to such other address as Lime or the City may designate to each other from time to time by written notice. Notices shall be deemed to have been given on the day sent or deposited; provided, however, that any time period for a response or responsive action to such notice shall be measured from the date such notice is actually received (any notice actually received after 5:00 PM at the site of receipt shall be deemed received on the following business day).

- 20. If either party is in default under this Agreement for a period of (a) ten (10) days following receipt of notice from the other party with respect to a default which may be cured solely by the payment of money, or (b) thirty (30) days following receipt of notice from the non-defaulting party with respect to a default which may not be cured solely by the payment of money, then, in either event, the non-defaulting party may pursue any remedies available to it against the defaulting party under applicable law, including, but not limited to, the right to enjoin any violation of the terms of this Agreement and the right to terminate this Agreement. If the non-monetary default may not reasonably be cured within a thirty (30) day period, this Agreement may not be terminated based upon such default of the defaulting party commences action to cure the default within such thirty (30) day period and proceeds with due diligence to fully cure the default.
- 21. The prevailing party in any action or proceeding in court or mutually agreed upon arbitration proceeding to enforce the terms of this Agreement is entitled to receive its reasonably attorneys' fees and other reasonable enforcement costs and expenses from the non-prevailing party.

KNOW ALL MEN BY THESE PRESENTS, this _____ day of _____, 20___, that CITY OF WASHINGTON, A MUNICIPAL CORPORATION, its successors and assigns, whether one or more and whether an individual, individuals, a corporation, or other legal entity (hereinafter "Grantor"), for and in consideration of the sum of Ten and No/100th Dollars (\$10.00) and other valuable consideration in hand paid, the receipt of which is hereby acknowledged, does hereby grant unto UNION ELECTRIC COMPANY d/b/a AMEREN MISSOURI, a Missouri corporation, its successors and assigns (hereinafter "Grantee"), a perpetual easement (hereinafter "Easement") with the right, privilege, and authority of Grantee, its agents, contractors, and subcontractors as access to survey, stake, construct, reconstruct, replace, use, operate, maintain, patrol, inspect, protect, repair, relocate, modify, add to the number of and remove an electric line and communications line or lines, consisting of wires, cables, fixtures, and appurtenances thereto (hereinafter individually and collectively "Facilities"), said easement only allows for overhang of the electric and communication line or lines. Part of the West three-fourths of Lot Four (4) of the Subdivision of the Estate of Rudolph Uhlenbrock, deceased, in the City of Washington, EXCEPT a strip of land 20 feet wide off the West side thereof which was condemned by the City for the widening of Stafford Street and EXCEPT a parcel conveyed to the City of Washington, described as follows: Beginning at the Northeast corner thereof, thence West along Fifth Street 18 feet, thence South 50 feet, thence East 18 feet, thence North 50 feet to the place of beginning; as described by deed thereof recorded in Deed Book 266 Page 114 of the Franklin County, Missouri Records.

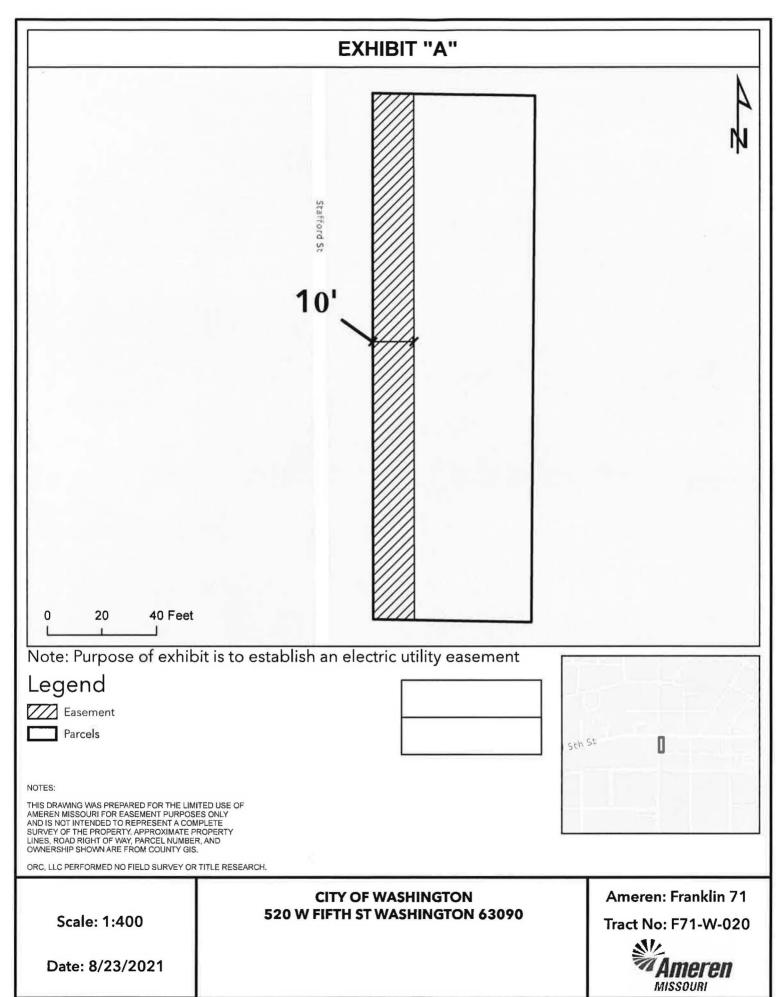

Honorable Mayor and City Council,

As you may be aware, before making a determination that a particular piece of equipment is needed, staff will annually review the equipment and discuss why it is needed. As such, the Parks and Recreation Commission and staff identified the need to install a playground at Phoenix Park. This project was approved in the Capital Improvement Sales Tax Fund in the 2021-2022 budget. Staff researched several interlocal contracts for cooperative purchases and found the HGAC cooperative purchasing program would give the City the best pricing.

Accordingly, the Parks and Recreation Commission and staff recommend that Council consider Landscape Structures' bid in the amount of \$243,756.00 for the purchase of a playground at Phoenix Park, which is under the budgeted amount of \$280,000.00. The purchase price includes equipment, installation, engineered wood fiber (as surfacing) and freight. The remaining budgeted amount will be used for demo, grading, base rock, drainage etc.

Whereas, the Code of the City of Washington, Missouri provides in Section 410.035(G)(5) that all minimum improvements shall be installed and approved in a subdivision before the final plat of the subdivision is submitted to the City of Washington, Missouri, unless written approval is given by the City Council to complete said improvements as the subdivision is developed; and

Whereas, pursuant to Section 410.035(G)(5), in lieu of the completion of the minimum improvements previous to the final approval of a plat, the City Council shall accept, at the option of the developer, an escrow secured with cash or an irrevocable letter of credit deposited with the City, or the City may accept a surety bond and such bond shall be in an amount and with surety and other reasonable conditions, providing for and securing the actual construction and installation of the minimum improvements; and

Whereas, the undersigned owner has requested the City Council of the City of Washington, Missouri, to grant final plat approval of "The Overlook at Weber Farms, Plat 6 Subdivision", even though all minimum improvements have not been installed and approved; and

Whereas, the City Engineer has determined that the amount of fourteen thousand five hundred and 00/100 Dollars (\$14,500), is equal to the cost of constructing, erecting and installing all improvements and utilities as shown on the Subdivision Improvement Plans not yet constructed, erected and installed.

Now, Therefore, in consideration of the acceptance and final plat approval by the City Council of the City of Washington, Missouri, of "The Overlook at Weber Farms, Plat 6 Subdivision", and in accordance with Section 410.035(G)(5) of the Code of the City of Washington, Missouri, the undersigned hereby agrees to furnish the City of Washington, Missouri, at the undersigned's option, an irrevocable letter of credit or an escrow secured with cash, in the amount of fourteen thousand five hundred and 00/100 Dollars (\$14,500), equal to the cost of constructing, erecting and installing all improvements and utilities as shown on the Subdivision Improvement Plans not yet constructed, erected and installed, as determined by the City Engineer. The City of Washington, Missouri may accept, in lieu of an irrevocable letter of credit or an escrow secured with cash, a surety bond with surety in

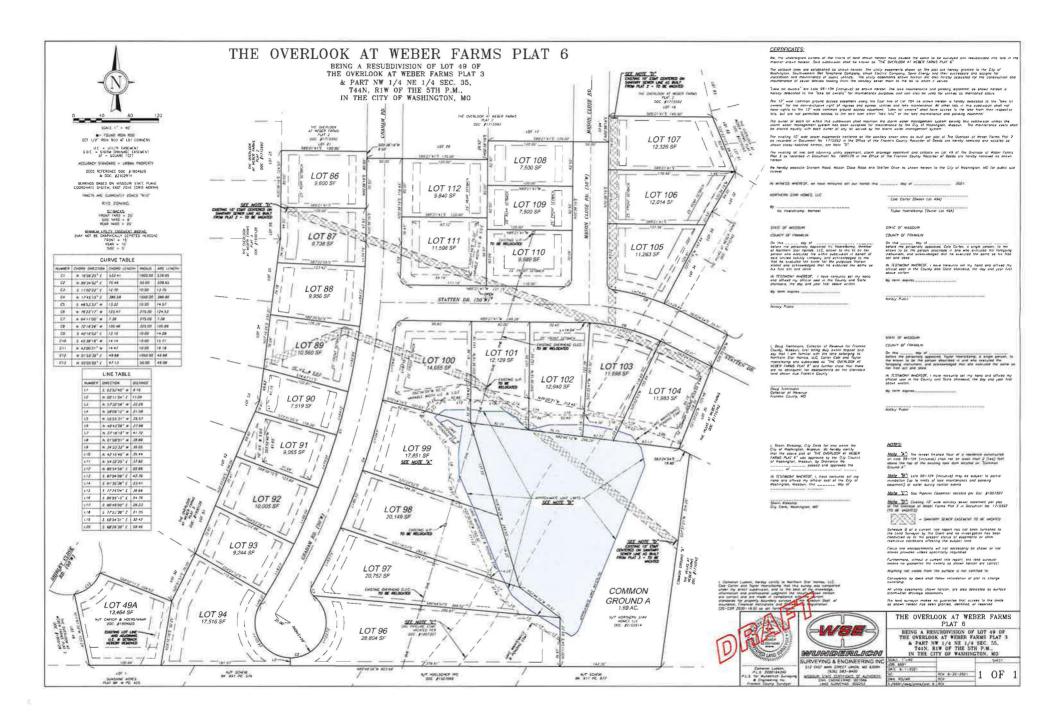
an amount and with surety and other reasonable conditions, providing for and securing the actual construction and installation of the improvements and utilities shown on the Subdivision Improvement Plans not yet constructed, erected and installed as determined by the City Engineer.

It is further understood and agreed the undersigned shall complete construction and installation of the improvements and shown on the Subdivision Improvement Plans not yet constructed, erected and installed as determined by the City Engineer within twenty four (24) months of the date hereof.

It is further understood and agreed to that no utility service connections or occupancy permits shall be issued to the owner, or to any other person, firm, corporation, association or partnership, for any structure, unless and until all utilities and improvements have been constructed, erected and installed in said structure and upon lots on which said structure is situated in accordance with the Subdivision Improvement Plans.

It is hereby further understood and agreed that no occupancy permit shall be issued to the owner or any other person, firm, corporation, association or partnership for any structure on any street that is not completed in front of or adjacent to such lots upon which such structure is situated.

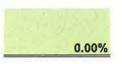

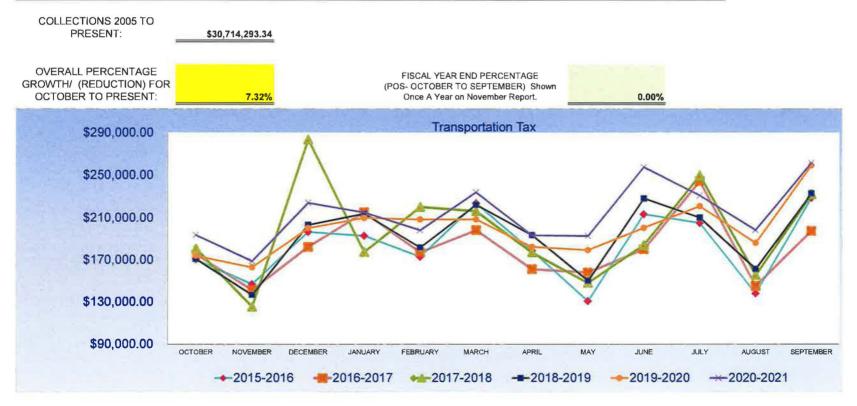

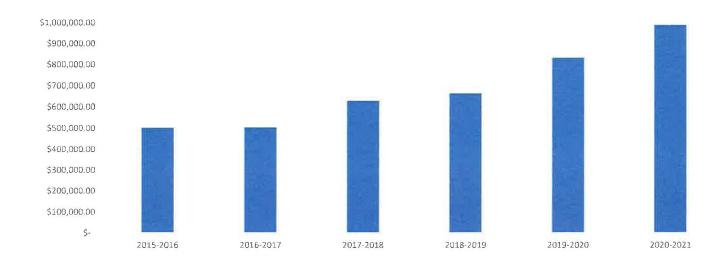

City to Pick Up Leaves in Two Rounds

City of Washington Crews will conduct two rounds of leaf pickups for residents this year (2021).

- -The first round is scheduled to Start **November 1**st and continue until each street has been picked up one time.
- -The second round is scheduled to Start **November 29th** and continue until each street has been picked up one time.

In both rounds crews will start picking up leaves on the east side of town and proceed to the west. If the leaves are not out on the day we are in your area, we will not come back to pick them up on the first round but will get them on the second round. If the leaves are not out on the day we are by on the second/last round, we will not be back!

Residents are asked to rake their leaves to the curb, but not place them in the streets, gutters or on sidewalks.

Residents are also asked to not park vehicles near the piles of leaves to make it easier for crews to pick them up. If vehicles are parked on or too close to the pile those leaves will be left and picked up on the second round as long as the vehicle is moved.



REMINDER: You can also bring your leaves to the Recycle Center at 400 Recycle Dr., if you miss the curbside pickup. Below are the hours for the Recycle Center.
