

## COMPREHENSIVE PLAN STEERING COMMITTEE OBJECTIVE

The Steering Committee serves as a representative body to ensure that Washington's residents and stakeholders are represented. The Steering Committee also serves as a regular liaison between planning process and all community residents to build awareness, consensus, and ensure that all residents have input and access to the development of the Plan.

All Washington residents and community members will have input and access to the development of the draft plan through the neighborhood meetings.

### ROLE AND RESPONSIBILITIES OF STEERING COMMITTEE MEMBERS:

- 1. Attend a total of three (3) meetings (schedule with dates to be provided). A proxy may be appointed to attend meetings.
- 2. Ensure that all updates and information, including dates and times for neighborhood meetings, is shared with their neighbors and/or other interested parties, as necessary.
- 3. Ensure that input and voting are representative of the residents and/or stakeholder groups that they represent.
- 4. Provide honest feedback and authentic support to other Steering Committee members.
- 5. Work with other Steering Committee Members to establish and maintain an open and respectful relationship.
- 6. Provide a respectful environment for dialogue and discussion.

## COLLECTIVELY AND INDIVIDUALLY, STEERING COMMITTEE MEMBERS WILL:

- Exhibit professionalism,
- Engage in constructive dialogue on challenging issues,
- Ensure that community interaction, involvement and accountability remain a priority and that the Steering Committee makes regular efforts to assess and improve its performance in this area.

#### WHAT IS A COMPREHENSIVE PLAN?

"In the preparation of the city plan, the commission shall make careful and comprehensive surveys and studies of the existing conditions and probable future growth of the municipality.

The plan shall be made with the general purpose of guiding and accomplishing a coordinated development of the municipality which will, in accordance with existing and future needs, best promote the general welfare, as well as efficiency and economy in the process of development."

Chapter 89, Section 89.350; RSMo



#### WHAT IS A COMPREHENSIVE PLAN?

A comprehensive plan is an **official document** adopted by a city as a **policy guide to decisions** about the physical development of the community.

- The plan is not a regulatory ordinance, but a guide to be used when regulatory ordinances are developed and administered.
- The plan is not a detailed capital improvement program showing precise locations of public improvements and community facilities; it is used as a guide in the detailed planning that must occur before those facilities are built.

The plan is a comprehensive document in that it covers all portions of the city and all facilities that relate to development.

#### WHAT IS A COMPREHENSIVE PLAN?

The current Comprehensive Plan was developed between 2011 and 2013, and adopted in April, 2013.









#### Q1: In what part of Washington do you live? (Please refer to the map below)




#### Q8: How long have you lived in Washington?




#### Q10: If you live in Washington, in what kind of home do you currently live?




#### Q12: How safe do you feel in your neighborhood?




# Q14: What places in Washington do you currently use / visit? (Check all that apply.)




#### Q15: What kinds of places is Washington missing? (Check all that apply.)




# Q17: If you can't buy something in Washington, where do you typically travel to visit those stores? (Check all that apply.)






#### Q21: How often do you visit Downtown?








Q24: When you visit Downtown, do you ever have trouble finding a place to park?

Q31: Compared to 10 years ago (2012), has the City of Washington as a whole gotten better or worse?








