Happy Summer!

We hope everyone had a safe and happy July 4th! With it now being the middle of summer, several capital improvement projects are under construction or finishing up. Just in time for the Washington Town & Country Fair next month, the new pavilion on the fairgrounds has been completed thanks to our partnership with the Fair board and the Chamber of Commerce. This will not only be a great asset for the Fair but also a place for additional pickleball courts for the rest of the year. We are also finishing up work on the Optimist Skate Park on Ninth Street. This

completed the second phase of improvements to the park. Currently under construction is our one million gallon ground water tank for the southeast area of the City. The tank is located at the southeast corner of North Goodes Mill Road and South Point Road. Construction should be completed by this winter and painting of the tank will be completed by the spring of 2024. Finally, we have completed two key transportation street connections. One was the second connection to Autumn Leaf Subdivision off of High Street to Sophia Drive. The second connection was the southern extension of Rabbit Trail Drive to Bieker Road. Enjoy the rest of the summer and we will see you at the Fair!

Summer is here & the Parks & Recreation Department is in full swing!

Attendance at the pool has been strong, swim lessons are in session, pavilion rentals are ongoing and Camp Washington is halfway over. Check out the front page for additional summer programming!

The Washington Town and Country Fair will take place in the Fairgrounds on August 2nd – 6th. Prep work for the Fair has already begun. The new fairgrounds pavilion and pickleball courts, a cooperative project between the Town & Country Fair Board and Parks Department, is almost complete. Pickleball lines will be painted and the courts will be ready for play in the fall. Seven new skate park features will arrive at the Optimist Skate Park later this summer, which will complete the \$150,000 renovation.

We have several other projects slated for 2023. We will install two new mini shelters at the South Point Bark Park, which were graciously donated by the Lions Club. We will also resume new trail installation at Miller Post Nature Reserve. If you haven't checked out the Nature Reserve yet, you are missing out on a hidden gem!

Did you know July is Parks and Recreation Month? Since 1985, people in the United States have celebrated Parks and Recreation Month in July to promote building strong, vibrant and resilient communities through the power of parks and recreation and to recognize the more than 160,000 full-time park and recreation professionals — along with hundreds of thousands of part-time and seasonal workers and volunteers — that maintain our country's local, state and community parks.

There's a lot to see and do in our park system parks! I hope you can find time to enjoy some outdoor activities this summer.

Acceptable Items for Recycling




